Five soldiers are killing nothing but time in a claustrophobic military hospital as they recover from injuries incurred in the line of duty in 1980s London and Belfast.

Their comical daily routine of TV, wind-ups and banter is challenged by the arrival of a young officer on their ward. Their camaraderie is threatened by a dangerous incident and an act of betrayal. But who has spilt the beans?

With charges of misconduct looming, accusations fly and the fighting really starts.

As we grow to like the lads, each of them learns that when the chips are down it's your mates that really matter.

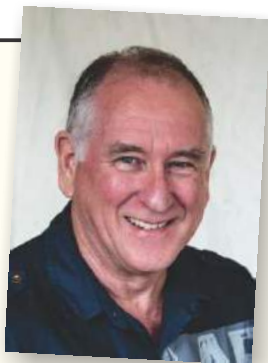

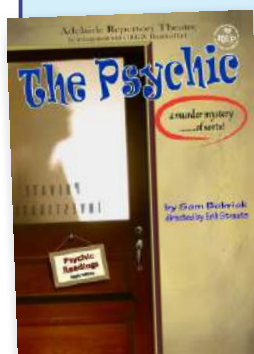

"Our Boys" is based on playwright Jonathan Lewis' own experience as an army scholar.

Just before he started army training he spent time in a military ward with the same condition suffered by the officer-in-training in the play.

While he personally never made it to the army, his rounded characters draw from his time among patients; it's a first-hand account of the tribulations, tedium and terror that young soldiers face when recovering from injuries incurred in the line of duty.

With insight and compassion, he shows that pranks, locker-room laughs, bravado and sexist banter often mask fragility.

"Our Boys" is searingly honest about the Army's neglect of our wounded heroes and displays the deep camaraderie that gets them through the worst of times.

Jonathan Lewis chose the life of a writer and actor, rather than army officer. "Our Boys" was his first play, for which he won The Writers' Guild Award for Best New Fringe Play, TAPS Writer Of The Year, and was nominated for the The Lloyds Bank Playwright Of The Year. He's since appeared on British TV in "Solider, Solider", "Holby City", "Casualty" and "Heartbeat" among many others.

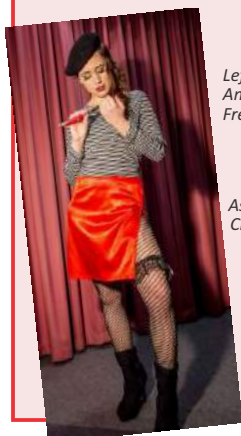
