re's nothing quite like a loving mother-daughter relationship....

June 23 - July 2

A black comedy with romance, rich language, tragedy and shocks. They're the enticing elements of the award-winning *The Beauty Queen of Leenane*, to be presented by Adelaide Repertory at the Arts Theatre in June.

The Beauty Queen is by brilliant young playwright Martin McDonagh, the first since Shakespeare to have four works running at the same time in London.

The play is set in the Irish village of Leenane, Connemara, in the 1990s. It takes place in a shabby kitchen, with a claustrophobic sense of entrapment. Maureen Folan, a 40-year-old spinster takes care of her 70-year-old, self-ish and manipulative mother Mag. Maureen, with a history of mental illness, is trapped in a seriously dysfunctional relationship with her mother. When Maureen discovers romance, things go out of control.

The plot is full of deceptions, secrets, betrayals and turnabouts that keep surprising the audience.

Thanks to our ensemble of character actors, backstage crew and front-of-house team for this flying start to 2011.




Take 39 Steps on the way to 100 Lunches



McDonagh's masterpiece of black comedy



Martin McDonagh

A masterpiece stands the test of time. The Rep's audiences will be able to apply that test when Martin McDonagh's *The Beauty Queen of Leenane* is staged in June.

The *Beauty Queen* won a haul of Tony awards for its actors on its New York debut in 1998. The play took out a swag of honours, including the New York Drama Desk Award for Outstanding New Play and the Outer Critics Circle Award for Best Broadway Play. A prolific playwright, filmmaker and screenwriter, McDonagh was declared the Critics' Circle most promising playwright in 1996. He has also won an Oscar in 2006 for his live-action short film *Six Shooter*.

But does McDonagh's talent shine on after the passing of a decade? All the signs are that the *Queen* has lost none of her beauty.

Lyn in Rep lead role

Lyn Pike is the new president of The Adelaide Repertory Theatre, after a much-valued two years by previous president Brian LeCornu.

Lyn has been a stalwart actor for the Rep since 1963 when she appeared in *Separate Tables*. Other roles have included *Pride and Prejudice*, *Arms and the Man* and The Sentimental Bloke. In 1982, Lyn started her own business as an actor's agent, casting consultant and crewing agent for film, stage and TV. "About two years ago, I decided to return to my first love, acting, and to give back to an industry that has given me my life's work," Lyn said.

Tracks cross from stage to board for 'Rails' players

Last year they were both tramping the boards in the Adelaide Rep's melodrama Love Rides The Rails. This year Penni Hamilton-Smith and Vicki Arnold are on the board of the Adelaide Rep.

Another board member is Pam O'Grady, who directed Love Rides The Rails. The links between Pam, Penni and Vicki doesn't end there.

Pam and Penni first appeared on stage together in the 1970s production of Jack Hibberd's *Dimboola* at the Olde King's Music Hall. Pam played the flowergirl to Penni's bridesmaid.

Penni's introduction to the Adelaide Repertory goes back to the 1960s after the opening of the brandnew Arts Theatre in Angas Street when she was at a get together of young actors in the Thomas Nave Room.

"I was a teenager who had appeared in a production of *David Copperfield* as Mrs Gummidge and in Noel Coward's *Hay Fever* with Miki Porter," Penni recalls.

"It was Miki's idea to spell my first name with an 'i' to match hers on the program."

Vicki's association with Pam O'Grady goes back to the 1980s when they were both in a Rep Christmas revue, Let's Get This Show




