### Noël Coward's

Forgotten Play!

Star Quality adapted by Christopher Luscombe 15 - 24 November

Noël Coward takes us behind the scenes of a new West End production called *Dark Heritage*, the veritable play within a play!

It's an authentic backstage world of talent and treachery with a gallery of unforgettable characters: the temperamental and manipulative leading lady, the ruthless director, a jaded old trouper and, caught in the middle, an innocent young playwright.

Star Quality has been called Coward's "wickedly funny final play" which shines the spotlight on the backstage world of theatrics.

"We're putting on a play, not fighting a bloody war. Why can't people in the theatre behave like normal human beings?"

This quote from the play is one which everyone involved in theatre will be familiar with!

Originally written by Coward in 1951 as a short story about the theatre business, Coward later adapted Star Quality for the stage (1967). However, despite a few readings, the play was never produced during Coward's lifetime.

The talented actor, Christopher Luscombe played the role of Noël Coward on stage and fell under the spell of the great Coward. Luscombe became a scholar of Noël Coward and having spent much time researching his life and works, Luscombe was able to put his finger on the problem with Coward's *Star Quality* - it was essentially a short story, more suited to a movie than a static stage. Too many scenes and locations, and far too many characters!

So Luscombe set about to study the essential story of Coward's Star Quality and he eventually adapted it for the modern stage. Luscombe has said that Coward initially wrote his short story "free of censorship" so that he had been "able to conjure up a rather more authentic account of the language and leanings of the theatrical profession"!

Who better to write a play about actors, directors and playwrights, than one of the most prodigious talents theatre has ever seen!

And it seems that the leading lady of Star Quality had a very famous muse... Our leading lady, Lorraine is said to have been modelled after Coward's great friend and colleague Gertie Lawrence!

Owing to the rising costs of producing theatre, the Rep is reluctantly raising the price of tickets.

The Rep has maintained ticket prices for many years now however with rising fees and charges we must now make small adjustments.

The increase will not take effect until 2013, and every effort has been made to minimise the amount that we pass on to you, our loyal supporters.

From next year our prices will be:
